PREFACE


St. Gregorios Dayabhavan is a registered society under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act, 1960, and a public charitable trust under section 12AA(1)(b)(i) of the IT Act, 1961. It has been operating from Kunigal Taluk of Tumkur District, Karnataka, since 2003. The Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Karnataka, recognizes the organization, which primarily serves children whose families are affected by the disease. In addition to childcare, the organization is involved in various community services such as healthcare, education, and empowering the rural population in Tumkur district.

Two recent initiatives include The ARK Multi-purpose Complex and Daya-Ashy Anupalana Gruha; the latter serves as an aftercare home for girls aged 18 to 23 years on our campus. The organization also operates a hospital cum palliative care centre. It runs two hospitals, one in Kunigal village and the other exclusively for AIDS/TB patients in Tumkur town. Inpatient and palliative care services are provided free of charge. The organization sponsors the education (tuition, dress, study materials, meal, and transportation) of all resident inmates (children above six years) as well as other disease-affected children (non-residential) from neighbouring villages. This support extends from kindergarten level to professional courses.

Regular outreach services and capacity-building campaigns benefit rural inhabitants. These include health camps, door-to-door health screenings, awareness programs for school children, blood donation campaigns, and other community services. St. Gregorios Dayabhavan maintains close ties with several healthcare institutions and government bodies, including the Department of Women and Child Development (Govt. of Karnataka), Karnataka Health Promotion Trust (KHPT), Karnataka State AIDS Prevention Society (KSAPS), Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA), National AIDS Control Organization (NACO), and Directorate of Minorities (Govt. of Karnataka). Collaborating with these entities, the organization implements healthcare programs in the district.

The core objective of this mission is to restore quality in the lives of distressed individuals in rural communities and enable them to pursue economic opportunities for self-sustainability. St. Gregorios Dayabhavan continually strives to fulfil the vision of its Founder President, the Late Lamented HG Dr Geevarghese Mar Osthathios Metropolitan. This report provides an overview of the organization's activities during 2022–23, which we illustrate on a beneficiary map.

B. HEALTH CARE

B1: Dayasparsha Hospital, Tumkur: An exclusive care and treatment center for HIV/TB

The hospital offers comprehensive medical and counselling support to patients afflicted with AIDS and Tuberculosis. Services provided include anti-retroviral therapy, nursing care, and palliative care. The committed staff regularly conducts health camps and outreach programs in rural communities, extending their services beyond the hospital premises. Notably, this hospital is one institution of its status in the neighbouring districts of Mandya, Ramnagara, Chikkaballapura, Chitradurga, Chikmagalur, and Hassan.

The hospital closely collaborates with prominent health organizations such as the National AIDS Control Organization, Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program, Karnataka Health Promotion Trust, and Karnataka State AIDS Prevention Society. The hospital expresses its gratitude for the invaluable support received from these organizations.

Remarkably, the Integrated Counseling & Testing Center (ICTC) identified only two new cases of HIV during the year 2022-23, a significant decline compared to the 15 cases identified in the preceding year (2021-22). Additionally, the number of bed days utilized increased to 6,756 in the current year, surpassing the previous year's figure of 5750. Data is in Table-2.

B2: Tuberculosis Treatment: Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programs (RNTCP)

The hospital provides a range of services for TB patients under the RNTCP (Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program) guidelines, which the District TB Department in Tumkur closely monitors. These services include:

- a) Sputum Collection, Transportation, Testing (SC, ST): The hospital facilitates the collecting, transporting, and testing of sputum samples from TB patients. This process is crucial for accurate diagnosis and monitoring of the disease.
- b) Advocacy, Communication & Social Mobilization Program (ACSM): The hospital actively engages in advocacy, communication, and social mobilization efforts to raise awareness about tuberculosis, its prevention, and treatment. These programs aim to educate the community and reduce the stigma associated with the disease.
- c) Directly Observed Treatment, Short Course (DOTS): The hospital implements the Directly Observed Treatment strategy, known as DOTS, a standardized approach for treating tuberculosis. It involves directly observing and supervising the administration of medicines to ensure patient compliance and improve treatment outcomes.
- d) Designated Microscopy Centre-cum-Treatment Unit (DMC & TU): The hospital operates as a Designated Microscopy Centre (DMC) where TB samples are examined microscopically for the presence of the bacteria. Additionally, it functions as a Treatment Unit (TU) where patients receive appropriate treatment and care in conformance with the RNTCP guidelines.

These services collectively contribute to the effective management and control of tuberculosis cases in the Tumkur District under the supervision of the District TB Department. A summary of services in 2022–23 is in Table 3.

C. CAPACITY BUILDING

C1: Daya-ACSM: Awareness program on HIV, TB, Mental Health, Suicide prevention, Health and Hygiene

RNTCP against Tuberculosis - Community Empowerment - 2022-23

Gregorios Dayabhavan plays a vital role as an implementing partner of the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program (RNTCP), actively engaging in awareness programs focused on Tuberculosis prevention and care. In the reporting year, the organization has successfully implemented advocacy, communication, and social mobilization (ACSM) programs across 18 villages in the Tumkur district, following the guidelines provided by the District/Zilla Panchayath health administration. For further details on the ACSM programs, please refer to Table-4.

- Basic facts about Tuberculosis; Different types of Tuberculosis
- Modes of transmission and common symptoms
- Available treatment options; Preventive measures
- Services provided at Dayabhavan and Government facilities.
- Role and responsibility of the public in Tuberculosis control efforts

ACSM programs help to empower the community with knowledge about Tuberculosis prevention and care. St. Gregorios Dayabhavan commits to combat the disease through different means for community benefit.

On 24th March 2023, we observed World Tuberculosis Day in Tumkur. As part of the event, interns of the MSW course performed street plays at various public places in Tumkur City. The purpose was to raise awareness about Tuberculosis and its consequences among the public.

Street plays served as an engaging and interactive way to educate people about the importance of Tuberculosis prevention, early detection, and proper treatment. Through dramatic performances, the interns effectively conveyed crucial information about Tuberculosis and its impact on individuals and communities.

Through their performance at public places in Tumkur City, we reached a diverse audience, including residents, commuters, and passersby, thus maximizing the outreach of the awareness campaign.



C2: Daya-Rakthadana Mission – Blood awareness, Donation and Transfusion



On the 8th of November 2022, we organized a Voluntary Blood Donation Camp at the Taluk office hall in Kunigal. The event was a collaborative effort involving our organization, Holy Trinity College, and other partnering organizations. Sri. Mahabaleshwar, Tahsildar and Taluk Magistrate graced the occasion.

The primary objective of the camp was to encourage voluntary blood donation and contribute to the availability of blood for those in need. We are proud to share that we collected 70 units of blood during the camp. Subsequently, we transferred the blood to Sanjeevini's Blood Bank, a reputed institution involved in blood transfusion services.

In recognition of the selfless act of blood donation, our team felicitated 11 individuals who had donated blood more than 25 times. Their dedication and commitment to saving lives through regular blood donation are truly commendable, and they serve as inspiring examples for others in the community.





C3: Daya-Vimukthi:

Daya-Vimukthi is an innovative initiative launched by St. Gregorios Dayabhavan to address the harmful effects of drug abuse, with a special focus on educating school children and youths about its consequences. The official inauguration of Daya-Vimukthi took place on the 3rd of December 2022 in Bangalore.

Recognizing the urgent need to combat drug abuse and its impact on individuals and communities, St. Gregorios Dayabhavan has taken proactive steps to raise awareness and provide education on this pressing issue. Daya-Vimukthi aims to empower young individuals with knowledge and resources to make informed choices and lead healthy, drug-free lives.



C4: Awareness Classes:

Among its social initiatives, St. Gregorios Dayabhavan has been actively conducting awareness classes on various important topics. These aim to educate individuals and communities about several crucial personal and social habits for well-being and public health, including the following:

- 1. Personal Hygiene: This class promotes good personal hygiene practices such as regular handwashing, dental hygiene, proper sanitation, and general cleanliness. It aims to raise awareness about the importance of personal hygiene in preventing the spread of diseases and maintaining overall health.
- 2. HIV Awareness: It educates individuals about HIV/AIDS, its transmission routes, prevention methods, and the importance of getting tested. It also addresses myths and misconceptions surrounding HIV/AIDS, promotes acceptance and support for individuals living with HIV, and encourages safe practices to prevent the transmission of the virus.
- 3. Suicide Prevention: It dedicates to raising awareness about suicide, its risk factors, and preventive measures. It aims to equip individuals with the knowledge and skills to identify warning signs, offer support, and seek help for themselves or others who experience distress. The class also promotes mental health and well-being as essential components of suicide prevention.
- 4. Prevention of Communicable Diseases: It provides information on preventing the spread of communicable diseases such as influenza, the common cold, measles, etc. It emphasizes the importance of vaccination, good hygiene practices, healthy lifestyle habits, and following appropriate protocols during disease outbreaks.

They serve as platforms for sharing valuable knowledge, dispelling misconceptions, and empowering individuals to make informed decisions about their health and well-being. St. Gregorios Dayabhavan's commitment to conducting these classes reflects their dedication to community empowerment and the promotion of public health.

D. DAYAKIRANA - INFANT CARE & ADOPTION CENTER

D1: Occupancy and Adoption

Dayakirana Specialized Adoption Agency, operated by St. Gregorios Dayabhavan, has been a partner NGO for the State Adoption Resource Agency (SARA) since 2018. It operates under the Integrated Child

Protection Society, Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA), and the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Karnataka.

During 2022-23, Dayakirana Specialized Adoption Agency provided care and support to 39 infants. Out of these, 15 infants were successfully placed under adoption, ensuring a loving and nurturing environment.

Additionally, as part of the adoption process, Dayabhavan conducted 16 comprehensive home-study reports to assess the suitability and readiness of prospective adoptive parents. These reports play a crucial role in matching children with suitable families.

Furthermore, the agency conducted 14 follow-up visits to monitor the well-being and adjustment of the adopted children in their new families. These visits ensure the ongoing support and welfare of the adopted children, assisting both the children and their adoptive families.

D2: Get together of Adoptees and adopted parents meet on 18 November 2022

A get-together event organized for Adoptees and adopted parents on 18th November 2022 at Dayakirana Adoption Center in Kunigal was an opportune platform to release posters and Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) materials to spread awareness about adoption. The program was presided over by Rev. Abraham Rambachan, Secretary of Dayabhavan and inaugurated by Dr C K Mathew, IAS, former Chief Secretary of Rajasthan.

Now, this program reaches out to 200 families to provide them with essential food supplies.
